

Every Kid Outdoors 2022-2023 Report

September 1, 2022 through August 31, 2023

A summary of the interagency Every Kid Outdoors program, which offers free access to federal land and water recreation sites for fourth graders and their families.

















Summary

The number of free fourth grade passes issued through the Every Kid Outdoors program (EKO) grew for the second year in a row, reaching 29% more than 2021-2022.

For the first time in program history, voucher requests came from all 50 states and 5 major territories.

Over 300,000 students participated in EKO programming administered by host agencies, a 52% increase over the previous year.

Our Next Generation of Stewards

Every Kid Outdoors mobilizes our next generation of stewards by introducing fourth graders to public lands in their backyards and beyond at an early age.

Research on EKO participants indicate that without free access, most (73%) would never have visited a national park¹. Research also shows that participants are more likely to visit parks throughout the rest of their lives if they experience parks with their family or school at age 10².

The Every Kid in a Park program began in 2015 as part of the National Park Service centennial. In September 2019, the program transitioned to Every Kid Outdoors with authorization through 2026 under the bipartisan Every Kid Outdoors Act (H.R. 1184).

Fourth graders or their families participate in EKO by visiting everykidoutdoors.gov or participating in an EKO program or event. Both engagement methods result in receipt of a voucher that can then be used to cover entrance or day use fees at federal recreation sites. Vouchers may be exchanged for a durable plastic pass at sites that issue annual passes.

Fourth graders redeemed vouchers for 143,926 passes at federal recreation sites.




